Implementing Mindfulness in Therapy I & II

This two-day modular workshop is designed to provide therapists and health care providers with an introduction to mindfulness, guidelines for interpersonal mindfulness, as well as knowledge and tools for integrating the mindfulness approach into therapeutic work with clients.
